## ELA

## ELA- Monday and Tuesdays = groups will be pulled based on lowest scoring TEKS from CAs or CFAs

M- small groups to work on lowest scoring TEKS-teacher will model reading passage and written responses (DNM, AGL, GL)

T- same small groups to work on lowest scoring TEKS-teacher will model thinking and finding evidence to answer questions and written responses (DNM, AGL, GL)

W- teachers will pull (GL, MGL) students to work in strategy groups for writing about reading and lower scoring TEKS

Th- teachers will pull (GL, MGL) students to work in strategy groups for writing about reading and lower scoring TEKS

F- meet with groups to check in-turn in work, make up STANG work, etc.

## Math/Science

Math/Sci- Wednesdays/Thursdays = groups will be pulled based on lowest scoring concepts from CAs or CFAs

M- teachers will pull (GL, MGL) students to work in groups for lower scoring math and sci concepts

T- teachers will pull (GL, MGL) students to work in groups for lower scoring math and sci concepts

W- teachers will work with small groups to intervene on lowest scoring math and sci concepts-teacher will model, and have guided practice activities (DNM, AGL, GL)

Th- teachers will work with small groups to intervene on lowest scoring math and sci concepts-teacher will model, and have guided practice activities (DNM, AGL, GL)

F- meet with groups to check in-turn in work, make up STANG work, etc.

- Teachers kept parent signed forms
- If a student breaks the contract, they LOSE technology privileges, conduct marks, parent call if needed, admin notified etc. (depending on situation)

To Parents/Guardians
We are sending home this Technology Contract so that students and aware of the expectations and procedures when using technology at Stewart E...............ese expectations are in place so that all students can continually have access to technology without confiscation, or limited resources due to broken technology (which can lead to a lengthy repair time).

This contract includes rules that:

- Students must carry technology with two hands from docking station to workstation
- Students will not eat or drink while using any device
- Students are only allowed to use teacher approved websites
- Students must be on the assigned website, app, or program during that class period
- Students must remain on task during technology time
- Students must return technology in the correct slot and plug in to charge at the end of the day.
- Students are not allowed to change any of the settings on the device at any time
- Students may not intentionally disrupt another student's technology usage
- Students who come across inappropriate text or image, should immediately notify the teacher
- Students are not allowed to take pictures or record (video or audio) anyone without specific directions by the teacher

Technology use at school is a privilege, not a right. Violations in any of the above could result in loss of technology privileges school-wide.
