

Continued Considerations

- 2010-2013 More students completed the course than attempted the exam (for example, Chemistry in 2010 had more than JUST 2 students in the class.)
- 2013 First year that 10th grade had no Advanced level classes (it was AP or regular). This only affected World History, BUT many students who would've gone advanced opted for AP that year. Newly aligned curriculum in World History Course/Exam
- 2014 FIRST year that all students enrolled in AP courses were required to take the AP exam at AHS.
- 2014 11th grade has no Advanced level class options (US History and English Language).
- 2015 No Advanced level for Seniors (English Literature, Government, Economics)
Physics Course redesigned by CollegeBoard. Physics B no longer exists. We now have Physics 1 and Physics 2
5 new AP Teachers this year
Government and Macroeconomics were offered in the traditional scheduling (1 semester for each)
AND in a "block style" scheduling--with each class meeting on alternate days all year. Students who opted for the block style committed to taking both courses and could not drop either one or change to the semester style in January
Students in the traditional schedule were not required to take both courses at the AP level.
- 2016 New Teachers in Economics and English Language.
- 2017 New Teachers in Government, English Literature
Second teacher added in English Language
Computer Science Principles added as a new course
Biology goes to single class period, not double-blocked
- 2018 New teacher in English Literature
AJH/Dual Language Students first year for Spanish Language Exam
- 2019 New teacher in English Literature
Added AP Seminar
Offered Spanish Language to all Seniors needing CCMR indicator.
AP Spanish Language offered via Edgenuity. Only 1 student who took the course tested.
- 2020 New Teachers in World History, English Language, Spanish Language, Government, Economics
Environmental Science, Psychology, Human Geography, and Capstone added as new courses
Offered Spanish Language to all Seniors needing CCMR indicator.
Spanish Literature attempted by 2 former DLP students
AP requires Art submissions to be more time intensive (examining process as well as finished product)
Psychology and Human Geography received textbooks late in the first semester. (Psych books arrived on campus with less than a month in the semester, for the first time since 2014, we allowed students to opt out of the exam, but had to do so in the fall semester (except for Eco--that deadline was Feb. 1)
Covid 19. Students participated in testing online from home. They could opt out at this late date with no penalty.
- 2021 New Teachers in English Literature, Psychology, Statistics, Biology
Added Music Theory, Computer Science A
Computer Science Principles has a curriculum realignment (from College Board)
Science, Math, Art, and Music Theory courses tested on paper. All others were online.
- 2022 2020 English Lit teacher returns to course
Physics 1 has a curriculum realignment (units 8-10 no longer tested)
