





Student by student, skill by skill

 General impressions of student performance (class averages, grades, etc.)

 Creating common formative assessments with a team Assessments differing in each class

- Using data from teacher-created common formative assessments to determine interventions and enrichments
- Exclusively using benchmark assessments to determine interventions and enrichments

- Teacher focus on common formative assessment data to drive instruction
- Teacher focus on benchmark data as the only standard measure of student growth and achievement
