## 2022-2023 Benchmark Meeting:

Review universal benchmark data to identify trends and determine/modify supports for students

- Tier I: General education teachers implement core instruction that is intended to be proactive and preventative in nature. Instruction is differentiated to meet the needs of all students. All students participate in District-determined universal screening/benchmark assessments, per the District's assessment calendar.
- Tier 2: Tier 2 interventions are provided by classroom teachers and/or other professionals to students who demonstrate the need for support in addition to the core curriculum provided in Tier 1. Progress monitoring occurs bi-weekly or as
- appropriate to the targeted skill area. Intervention is revisited after 6-8 weeks with at least 3 progress monitoring data points.
- Tier 3: Tier 3 interventions are provided by specialized staff to students who demonstrate a level of need beyond Tier 2. Progress monitoring occurs weekly based on the targeted skill area. Intervention is revisited after 6-8 weeks with at least 6 progress monitoring data points.
