

The PLC Process

What are we TIGHT about in the PLC Process?

- 1. Work in collaborative teams and take collective responsibility for student learning rather than work in isolation.
- 2. Implement a guaranteed and viable curriculum.
- 3. **Monitor student learning through an ongoing assessment process** that includes frequent, team-developed **common formative assessments**.
- 4. Use the results of common assessments to:
 - Improve individual practice
 - Build the team's capacity to achieve its goals
 - Intervene or extend on behalf of students
- 5. **Provide systematic interventions and extensions**.

The "Right Work"

Collaborative Teams should always focus on these FOUR ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS:

- 1. What do we want all students to learn?
- 2. How do we know if students learn it?
- 3. How do we respond when students do not learn it?
- 4. How do we respond when students do learn it?

<u>Remember:</u> Collaborative Time should focus on the **identified learning targets** - not on everything that you teach!
