PLC Overview

- A PLC is...
 - ...an ongoing process in which educators work collaboratively, through inquiry and action research, to achieve better results.
- The 3 Big Ideas:
 - We focus on learning for all (students and educators)
 - We collaborate and take collective responsibility
 - We are **results oriented** and make **evidence based decisions**
- The 4 Questions:
 - What do we want them to know?
 - How will we know that they have learned it?
 - What do we do if they DIDN'T learn it?
 - What happens if they DID learn it?
- 5 Tight Elements:
 - We collaborate and take collective responsibility
 - We have a guaranteed, viable curriculum
 - We use frequent CFAs to measure learning
 - We use results of CFAs to inform instruction
