- Chronic absenteeism for all students grades 9-12 will decrease to 12% by May 2020.
- 75% of Seniors will earn a National Career Ready Certificate of Silver, Gold, or Platinum through the ACT WorkKeys assessment by May 2020.
- 39% of Juniors will meet the ACT English benchmark (18) on the state ACT test in March 2020.
