

Goal 1: Reduce the number of students with 14+ absences in any one class to 15% or less. Utilize a system of incentives and celebrations for students on track to achieve the attendance target.

Goal 2: Grow the percent of students in each cohort (using year to year trend data) achieving the Wyoming Readiness Benchmark on WyTOPP, Aspire and ACT in Reading, Math, Science and English.

Goal 3: Reduce the number of students scoring an ACT of 18 or below to 25% or less; increase students scoring an ACT of 21+ to 60% or more. Raise the Bar, Close the GAP: 2006 ACT College and Workforce Readiness Study concluded the <u>math</u> and <u>reading</u> skills needed to be an electrician/carpenter/plumber are the same needed to be a successful first year college student. **Career/College/Military Readiness = High Expectations for ALL).

Goal 4: Positive student engagement will be a focus, with 90% of all students involved in WHSAA athletics or an activity, or an organized school sponsored club that meets regularly.

Goal 5: Build "Sources of Strength" peer to peer mentoring. Utilize ACT Tessera to measure social/emotional skills. Student perception survey results will be used to evaluate school climate.
