Professional Learning

September 10

To ensure our first round of Collaborative Inquiry (CI) began with a strong start, our Professional Learning for teachers on September 9th was dedicated to preparing differentiated learning materials and solidify plans to launch each grade level's first CI goal with success.

September 17

September 17th was spent curriculum planning by grade level teams. Teachers collaborated on current and upcoming Core Knowledge units of study. Collaboration centered on appropriate pacing of units, upcoming assessments, and planning for ways to enrich the Core Knowledge curriculum with hands-on experiences and aligned field trips.

September 24

Wendy Mitchell came to provide a training on how to use our newly adopted grading program, PowerTeacher Pro (PTP). WSCA has been using this grading program for some time, but it is new for our elementary staff. Part of this move to add on PTP to our previous grading system, Illuminate, is to simplify access to report cards and grades for families, students, and staff. Our goal is to move to a digital report card by Trimester 3 and Wendy was instrumental in setting staff up for success. Any change can be challenging, but after Wendy presented her training session, there was a sigh of relief and a positive buzz about the simplicity of the new program and what it can offer.



October 1

As Trimester 1 report cards are approaching, teachers met in their Professional Learning Teams (PLTs) to evaluate their curriculum pacing and align their reporting on Essential Standards. This is an important day of planning because it focuses discussions on what standards have been covered, what common assessments will be given to determine student proficiency, and reflection on the current pacing of curriculum to ensure alignment and consistency among each grade level.

October 14

A Collaborative Inquiry (C.I.) goal is identified based on current student data and need. Once identified, teachers provide specific instruction that helps our students succeed through differentiated instruction. Please see the table below for all goals identified at each grade level. Second Grade Asian Civilizations


