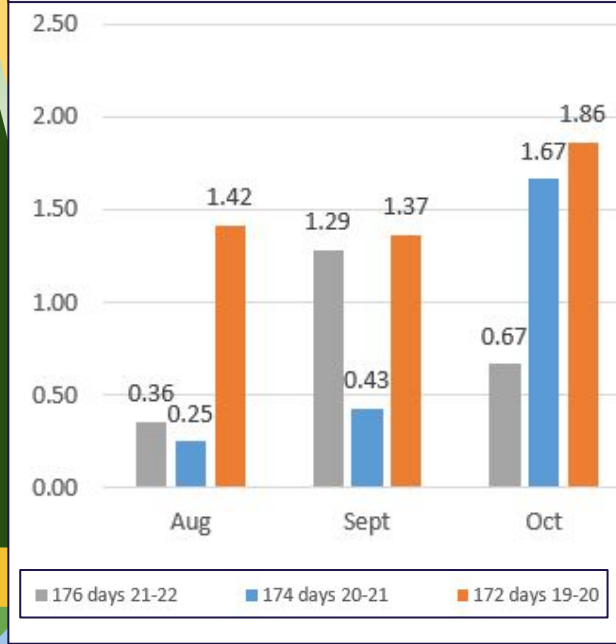

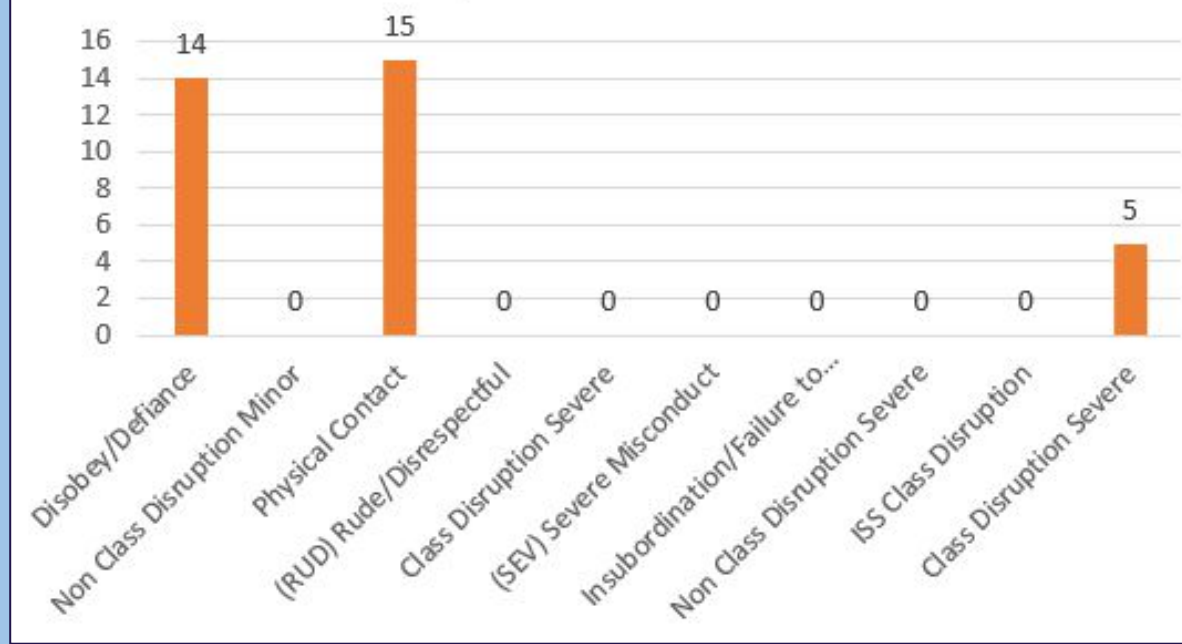

Referrals by Month & Top Reasons for ODR'S

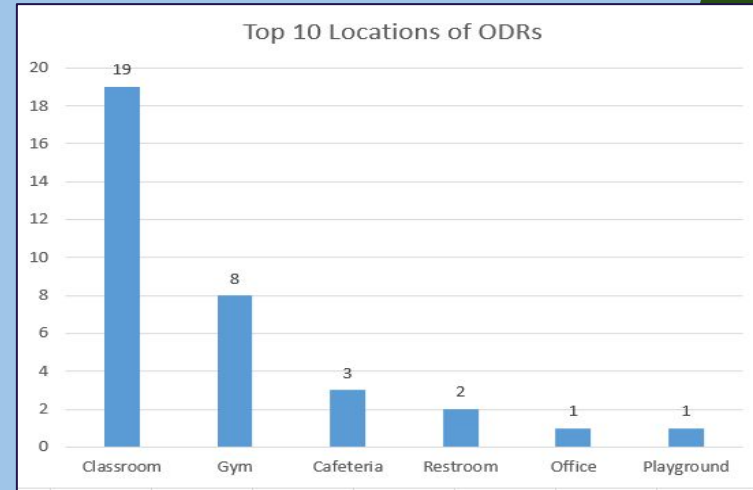
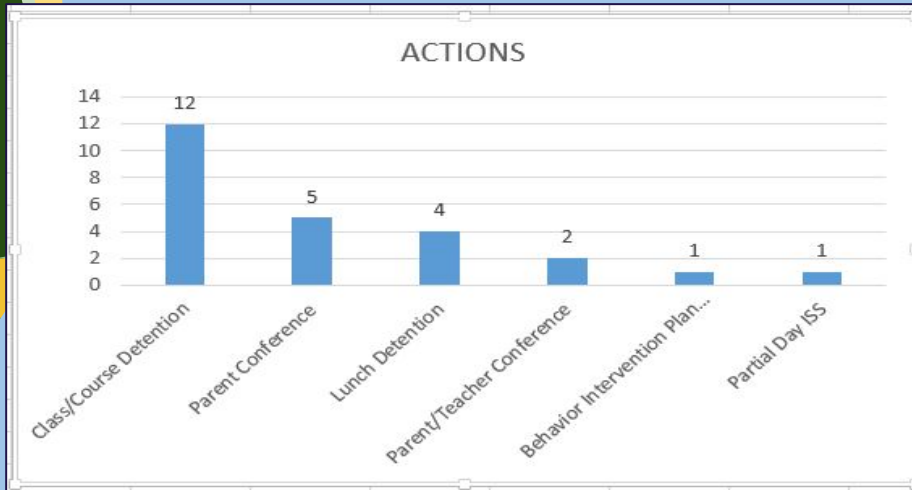
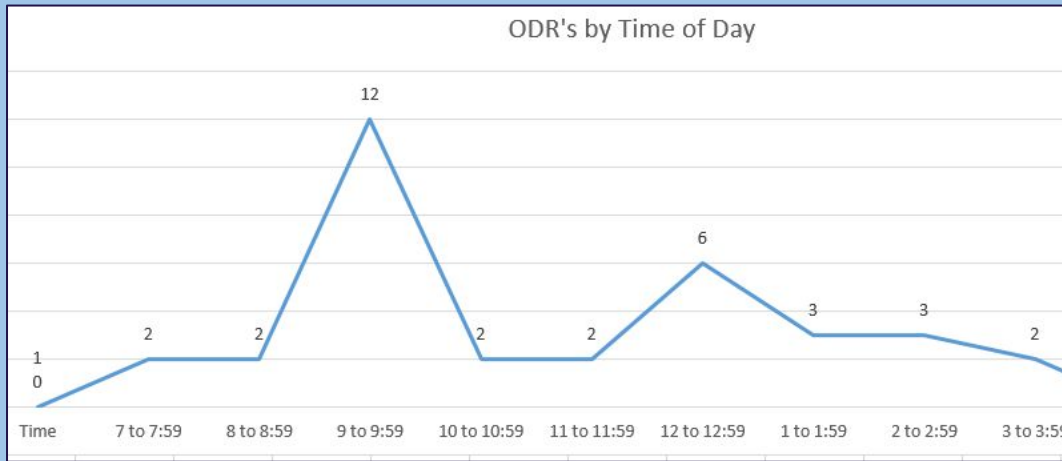
Avg. ODRs Per Day by Month

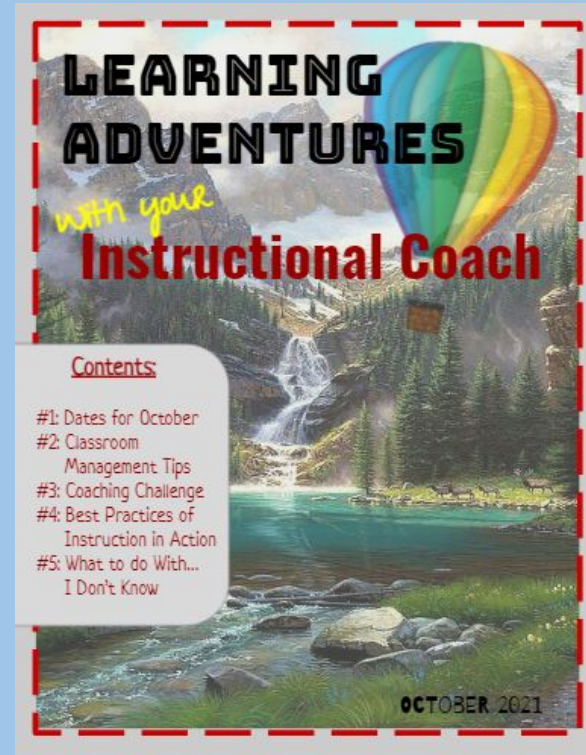

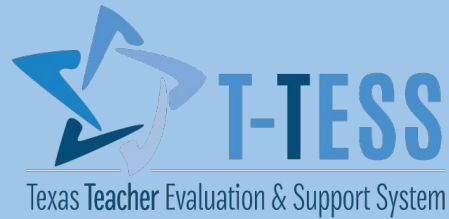
